JURY GETS IT RIGHT – DON'T CHEAT OR LIE.

Los Angeles, California - Local residents Anthony Person and Glenda Person were awarded almost **\$4 Million** on Thursday, February 15, 2007 by a jury in the Los Angeles Superior Court. The Persons sued defendants Anthony Giangrande, Harold B. Stadler and Les Crodgen for breach of a 5 year employment agreement, fraud, concealment, conspiracy, and severe emotional distress.

Anthony Person testified that he spent 2 years finding financial partners to purchase a company, Brassfield Communications, Inc., a low voltage system integrator located in the City of Commerce. As a result of this transaction, Anthony Person became a 20% shareholder and owner, a director, and the President & Chief Operating Officer of Brassfield.

Fourteen months after he and the defendants purchased the company, and 7 days after Anthony and Glenda Person signed a guarantee of a \$3 million loan to Brassfield and a trust deed on their home, the defendants arbitrarily, and without notice or cause, told Anthony Person that he was fired, accused him of trespassing, changed the locks and hired a security guard to keep him out.

A twelve member jury deliberated 2 ½ days to

reach a verdict in excess of \$3.9 Million in favor of Glenda & Anthony Person (\$1.2M for compensatory damages and \$2.735M for punitive damages). Plaintiffs' attorneys, Paul Evan Greenwald, Paul A. Hoffman and John R. Flocken of Greenwald & Hoffman, LLP in Santa Ana, California, argued that defendants defrauded plaintiffs and breached their employment agreement, which caused severe emotional distress. Giangrande testified during his video deposition that, "in brutal terms," he was looking for the cheapest way to "get rid" of Anthony Person.

"I am very pleased by the verdict, because it clearly sends a loud and clear message that you should honor your promises," Greenwald said, after the verdict was read. He also said that "our system of justice, with a jury trial, is alive, well, and really does work."

Plaintiff Anthony Person holds a Bachelors Degree in addition to an MBA, and has worked in the security industry for over 20 years. But for the defendants' unfounded firing, he has risen quickly through the ranks, and is highly respected by those he has worked with.

Mr. Greenwald used various clips from video depositions of the defendants during the presentation of the case and commented that he believed it was very effective.
